

Prof. Kung-Chung Liu studied law at National Taiwan University where he received Bachelor of Law, Master of Law. He later made his Doctor of Law at the Ludwig Maximilian Universität (University of Munich) Germany.

In 1992, Prof. Liu became an Assistant Research Fellow at the Institute for Social Sciences and Philosophy (Jurisprudence Division), Academia Sinica. In 1996, he was promoted as an Associate Research Fellow. Since 2002, Prof. Liu has been a Research Fellow. Beginning from 2004, his working affiliation switched to Institutum Iurisprudentiae, due to restructure within Academia Sinica.

From December 2003 to April 2004 Professor Liu was invited by the IP Academy Singapore and Law School National University of Singapore to act as visiting Senior Research Fellow and visiting Associate Professor, where he taught a course on Comparative Communications Law. From 17 February 2006 to 12 April 2007 Professor Liu took leave from the Academia Sinica to serve as one of the founding Commissioners of the National Communications Commission in Taiwan.

Beginning from 2007 Professor Liu is co-appointed professor of the Institute of Law for Science and Technology, National Tsing Hua University. Beginning from 2010 Professor Liu is also co-appointed professor of the Graduate Institute of Technology, Innovation & Intellectual Property Management, National Chengchi University. Between 14 April 2014 and 13 July 2015 Professor Liu was visiting professor at the School of Law, Singapore Management University, and the founding Director of the “Applied Research Center for Intellectual Assets and the Law in Asia” (ARCIALA). Beginning from 14 July 2015 Professor Liu resumes his post at Academia Sinica and becomes the external director of ARCIALA.

Professor Liu’s teaching and research interests are intellectual property law, antitrust and unfair competition law, and communications law.

Professor Liu authored 14 books (in Chinese and three in Mainland China) covering trademark law, competition law, patent law, interface between IP and competition law, (tele)communications law and over 100 peer-reviewed papers in Chinese and English (four in Mainland China).
